Martial arts program offers fitness and teaches focus, confidence

Some competitors were a bit nervous and some were a bit scared, but all did their best in the first Lancaster Family YMCA Taekwondo Tournament on Saturday.

The partnership of Korean Martial Arts and the YMCA is part of the Y's SafeKids Program.

The event began with a demonstration of skills from tourney director Master Steve Kirby (a fifth degree black belt) and his students.

"We had a great day," Kirby said. "We saw how the kids realized their ability to take those nervous and scared feelings and turn them into very positive results."

Kirby's wife, program director Judy Kirby, added, "We hope that it is a life lesson they can use in the future when they find themselves

facing new situations."

Competitors represented YMCAs from Lancaster, Lebanon, Littlestown and Reading, plus a contingency from the School District of Lancaster's Life After School Program.

Lisa Clement of Lancaster stepped in front of the group of 200 youths, parents and special guests and showed Taekwondo skills using her fists and feet.

Later, during the tourney, she used the same skills to earn a first place finish in a sport characterized by its fast, high spinning kicks.

Among the special guests were State Representative Roy Baldwin and Lancaster Mayor Charlie Smithgall.

Baldwin, who is a wellness advocate, said, "With the problem with children's obesity today, this program is an important alterna-

tive for a healthy lifestyle."

During a demonstration, Kirby showed the advanced skills and focus of taekwondo by walking on eggs without breaking them and crunching everything from wood to concrete with his bare feet and hands.

"The program, which has been in Lancaster for about a year shows the kids how they can not only feel healthier, but use their improved focus and concentration to get higher grades in school," Kirby said.

The SafeKids program emphasizes stranger danger, gang avoidance, gun avoidance, drug avoidance, correct use of the 911 system and the art of taekwondo.

Susana Lopez-Puffer said, "I love this program. It teaches children discipline and respect. The kids find that if they put their mind to something they can do it."

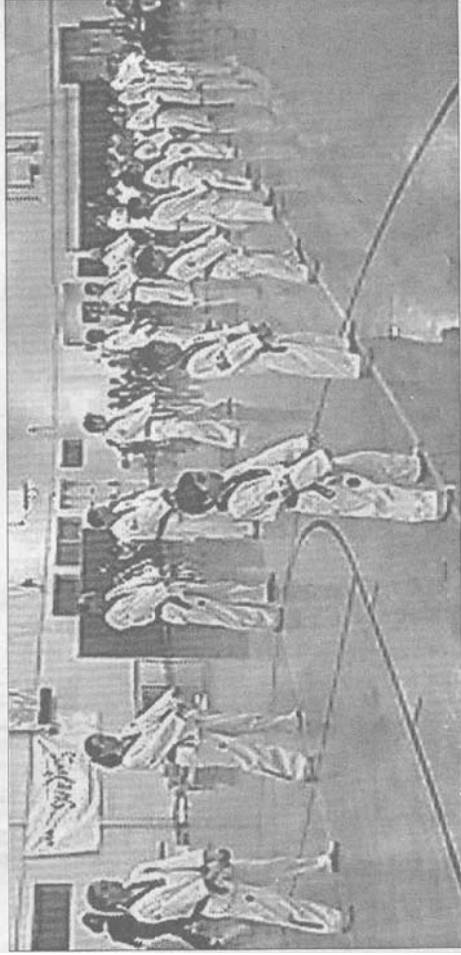

Martial arts event hosted by YMCA

Program showcases course that teaches self-defense to city kids

Steve Kirby used lightning fast movement and a quick flick of his wrist and the top of the liquor bottle was left lying on the ground without a drop spilling on to the floor. This is one of many highlights at the second annual taekwondo exhibition at the Lancaster YMCA Saturday afternoon.

Kirby, a fifth-degree black belt and master of martial arts, who has been involved in the sport for more than 25 years, displayed a variety of amazing breaks to the crowd of more than 100 students and parents.

Lancaster mayor Rick Gray was also in attendance to witness the event. Taekwondo is characterized by fast, high spinning kicks. This was the early part of the show, which featured the extensive break tests that can be done in the sport. The afternoon session featured a taekwondo tournament, and involved many local children showing off moves and skills.

Some of the items Kirby

broke by using his hands and feet included a baseball bat, two-by-four boards hanging from a harness, bricks and a set of six blocks piled on top of each other.

Kirby's son, a holder of a black belt himself, and others holding higher level belts, also performed a variety of breaks, often shattering boards while someone else held them in place.

This demonstration was done to highlight the Thursday night martial arts program offered to Lancaster City children by Kirby and his assistants as a way for them to learn about self-defense and fly through life.

"Taekwondo gives people a chance to lift off the ground. The sport focuses on individual accomplishment and gives participants a better sense of confidence and self-esteem," Kirby said.

The Lancaster program is also offered by Kirby's staff at other YMCA's throughout central Pennsylvania. The program costs \$5 a night per student, with a \$15 registra-

tion fee, but the weekly fee means there is no long-term commitment, Tom Baughman, Associate Executive Director for the Lancaster Y, explained.

"We wanted to keep this program inexpensive. We ran this show last year and it helped us increase our numbers for the program. The children and parents get to see how the masters do in the sport and it gives them a chance to dream of reaching that level themselves," Baughman said. "The program gives kids the confidence to use this knowledge of the sport for self-defense someday in life."

Kirby laughed and joked as he attempted the variety of stunts, but did warn the crowd not to attempt any of them at home. When he broke the bottle, there was a jagged piece sticking up, one of the reasons why the stunts should be left to professionals.

"These are very dangerous. I have 25 years of experience that give me the authority to try these tricks for you

today," Baughman said to the young white belt taekwondo students sitting on the floor in front of him.

Kirby thanked Gray and Baughman for starting this program and supporting his vision of teaching the children about self-defense in his Safe Kids campaign.

Kirby's staff spends much of the year distributing fliers in schools throughout the area about gun and weapon avoidance.

He also talked about his after-school program, where children ages five and older can come learn the sport and stay off the streets in the afternoons.

"This exhibition is a great way to bring the community together to celebrate the sport and the safe kids' initiative," Kirby said.

Mayor Gray said the sport has an interesting level of discipline for people of all ages. "To say this demonstration was impressive is an understatement. It is very appropriate for Lancaster that Steve is teaching these kids

about self-defense without weapons."

Twelve earning black belts honored

The gymnasium at the Lancaster YMCA was filled with broken cinder blocks and boards as part of the second annual taekwondo exhibition Saturday night.

Various demonstrations of forms, kicks and breaks were in display, as well as the coronation of 12 new Black Belts of various ages in the event witnessed by 200 plus parents, community members and stu-

dents in the program currently held at six YMCA locations.

The show included 100 students participating in the demo and a variety of high-level Black Belt instructors.

Master Steve Kirby is in charge of the program. Kirby, a fifth-degree Black Belt who is currently testing for the sixth-degree classification next year in Korea, explained to the attending crowd the various moves and training required for each student to progress through the belts.

"Taekwondo is the Korean style of martial arts," Kirby said. "It is the Korean national sport and is part of the Olympics. It also is the most exciting form of personal expression among the martial arts."

Two highlights of the evening were the expertise of Gus Acuascut and the motorcycle trick. Acuascut, a second-degree Black Belt who is testing for a third degree he will receive next year in Korea, broke three cinder blocks with his hand.

He was unsuccessful on his try of five blocks, which Kirby said was due to them being damp. A fellow black belt, Jim Oplinger, broke one cinder block using his forearm.

The motorcycle trick, which excited the crowd, used a 2006 Harley-Davidson soft tail belonging to one of the adult students. During the trick, one of the newly awarded black belts, Jim Long, 15, of the Anville-Cleona School District, jumped over the stationary bike and kicked out with his

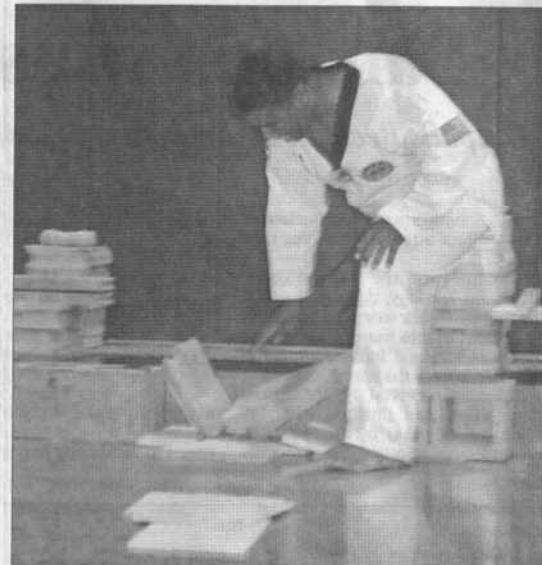
legs, shattering boards held in the air. Two other students also jumped over the bike as part of the trick. "I was not sure how tall the bike was, but I am happy how it turned out. I hope the crowd liked it," said Long, who started in the sport three years ago.

"My dad was into martial arts and told me about it. I love it because it takes a lot of mental preparation, but if you put your mind to it, you can accomplish anything," Long said.

Long's younger sister, Tabitha, 12, also earned her black belt, a crowning achievement after three and a half years of work in the sport. "I worked hard and pushed myself to get my body in shape. I was glad to get this belt as the hard work has paid off," Tabby Long said.

Kirby said those earning the black belts worked for anywhere between two and a half to three years to make it to this level.

During Saturday's ceremony, the students were honored,

taking off their red belts and holding them at their sides while other students tied the new belt around their waists.

"It is an awesome accomplishment to earn a black belt and the YMCA is so proud of all the hard work they put in to accomplish this goal," Tom Baughman, Associate Executive Director of the Lancaster YMCA said. "It is great to see a YMCA program touch so many kids, adults and families."

The 12 students who were in the first Dan Class, or black belt class, were: John Harvey, Dorden Bivings, Bethany Joy Hess, Timothy and Tabitha Long, Kyle Lefever, Collin Meckley, Tyler Griffin, Rachel Freeman, Lisa Clement, Samuel Betancourt, and Quinn Harvey.

Freeman, 10, said she was excited to earn her black belt. "It was really hard to get to this level. There are a lot of kicks and breaks, and I got nervous during the demonstration."

Another trick involved jumping in the air over two students, who were each holding boards, and shattering the wood without stepping on the

prone students. Each trick brought a cheer and excitement from the crowd.

The taekwondo program is held in schools throughout Lancaster County and in their after-school programs.

Kirby's wife Judith, a first degree black belt, deals directly with all the YMCA facilities to keep the program going strong.

Judith and Steve have two sons, Scott and Chris, who are also black belts in taekwondo. Chris was one of the helpers at Saturday's event. There are three other instructors in the program.

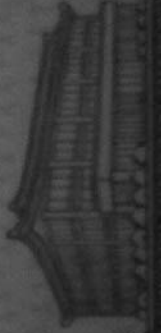

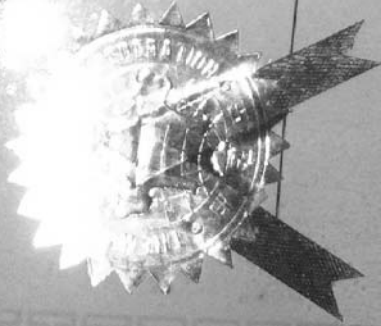

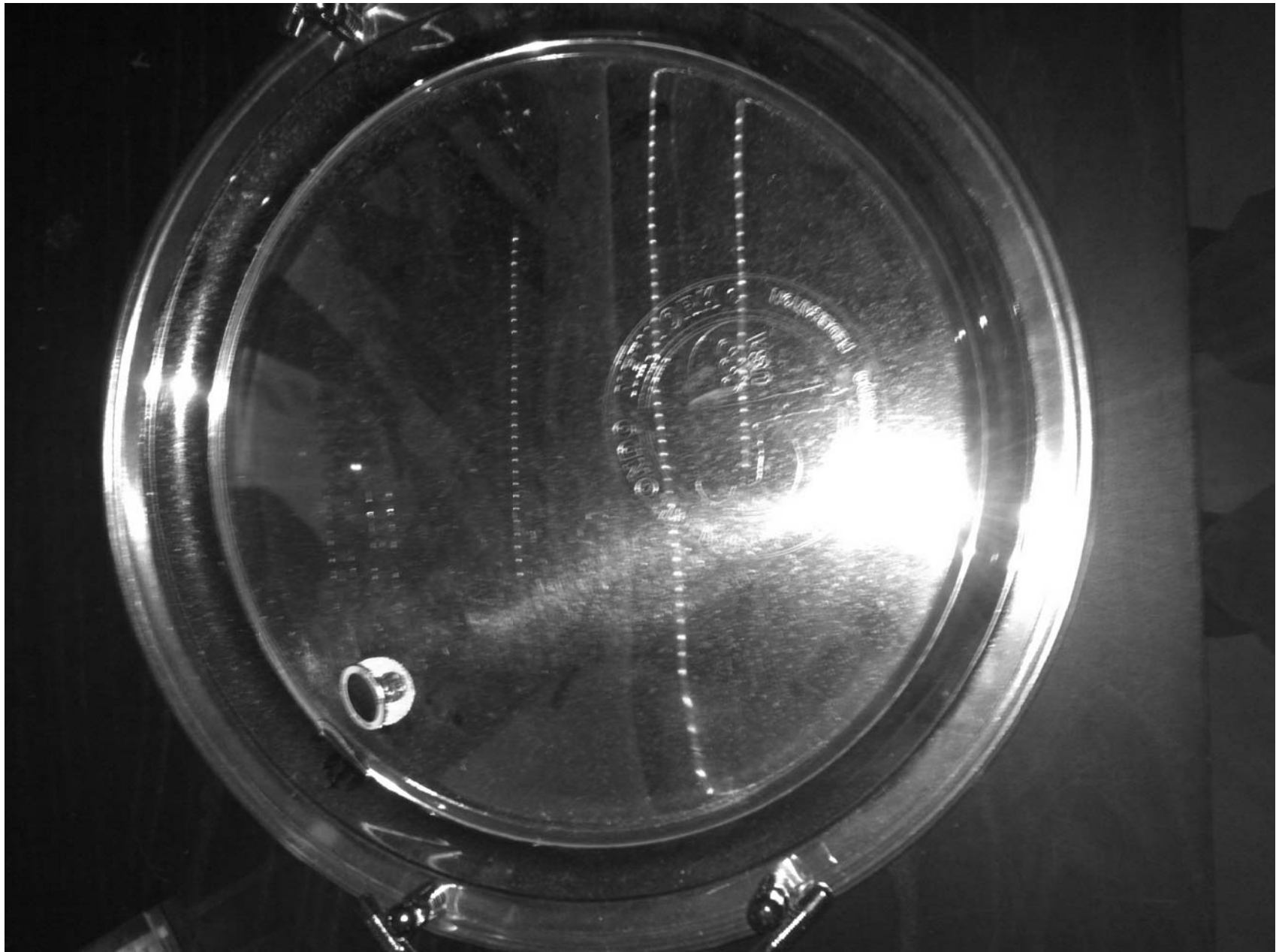
